# **AGOA Objectives**

Promote increased trade and investment between the U.S. and sub-Saharan African countries.

Promote increased access and opportunities for U.S. investors and businesses in sub-Saharan Africa.

Promote economic development and reforms in sub-Saharan Africa.







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# **Benefits of AGOA**

□ AGOA allows more than 6,400 products to benefit duty free treatment.

□ AGOA adds 1,800 products to GSP, including import sensitive products not eligible for GSP.

Examples of Articles ineligible for GSP treatment which can be entered duty free under AGOA if made in a SSA country:

- Apparel and textiles products
- Some Food products
- Electronic Articles
- Footwear, Handbags, Luggage, Flat Goods, Work Gloves, and Leather Apparel





# **Requirements for AGOA Benefits**

- Country must be eligible
   Product must be eligible
   Product must meet requirements of the rules of origin
   Product must be imported directly
- 5. Importer must claim AGOA when filling the entry document

Garments & Textiles

Requires an AGOA Textile Visa arrangement with the U.S. to prevent illegal transshipment and use of counterfeit documentation, as well as effective enforcement and verification procedures.

# **AGOA** Textile Visa Stamp

- Circular stamp
- Blue ink
- Must appear on the front of the original commercial invoice
- One Stamp per grouping
- Must be signed by authorized government official

# Food and Drug Administration (FDA)

The facilities that produce, store or otherwise handle the products are registered with FDA

Prior notice of incoming shipments is provided to FDA Imported food products are subject to FDA inspection at U.S. ports of entry FDA may detain products offered for import if they are not in compliance with U.S. requirements







# What does FDA regulate? Foods, Drugs, Cosmetics, Tobacco products, etc...

- Dietary supplements and dietary ingredients
- Infant formula
- Beverages (including alcoholic beverages and bottled water)
- Fruits and vegetables
- Fish and seafood
- Dairy products and shell eggs

- Live food animals
- Animal feeds and pet food
- Raw agricultural commodities for use as food or components of food
- Canned and frozen foods
- Bakery goods, snack food, and candy (including chewing gum).





Retail packages and containers of food products sold in U.S. interstate commerce bear labels in English that include specific information


- The identity of the product
- The name, address and/or phone number of the responsible firm (may be the manufacturer or distributor, foreign or domestic)
- A list of ingredients in descending order or predominance in the product
- The net weight of contents
- Nutritional information in most cases
- Country of origin statement
- Explicit listing of allergenic ingredients
















# **Net Quantity of Contents**

The net quantity statement (net quantity of contents) is placed as a distinct item in the bottom 30 percent of the principal display panel, in lines generally parallel with the base of the container.

Food labels printed must show the net contents in both metric (grams, kilograms, milliliters, liters) and U.S. Customary System (ounces, pounds, fluid ounces) terms.

#### **Type Size for Certain Elements**

- Serving Size information must also be bolded in at least 10-point type
- On Many labels, Calories must be bolded in 16 points type, while its value must be bolded in 22-point type.

#### **Declaration for Added Sugars**

Sugars added during food processing, sugars packaged with the intention of being added to food, and certain naturally-occurring sugars must be declared separately from Total Sugars.

#### **Nutrient Information**

Quantities for Vitamin D, Calcium, Iron, and Potassium must be listed.

Quantities for these nutrients must be expressed in milligrams or micrograms.

Vitamin D 2mcg	10%
Calcium 260mg	20%
Iron 8mg	45%
 Potassium 235mg	6%

Daily values for nutrients like sodium, dietary fiber and Vitamin D are being updated based on newer scientific evidence (2015-2020 Dietary Guidelines for Americans).





#### **Change in Footnote**

% Daily Value (DV) is now defined in the footnote.

Foods intended for children aged I to 3 years must substitute 2000 calories by 1000.



\*The % Daily Value (DV) tells you how much a nutrient in a serving of food contributes to a daily diet. 2,000 calories a day is used for general nutrition advice.
